Enough of the adults. Our juniors really excelled at the U.S. Junior Olympic National Racquetball Tournament held in Portland, Oregon in June. Over 300 juniors from across the nation participated in this tournament. Kristen Walsh took second in the Girls 16 and under Singles Division. She also took second in the 16- Mixed Doubles and 18- Girls Doubles. Did you read the great article in the Salt Lake Tribune about Kristen? Her picture covered half of the front page of the Sports section on July 21. She is a member of the Junior Olympic Team and will be doing a lot of traveling with them. Congratulations, Kristen!

John Sanderson also did well in Portland. He took 3rd in the 8 and under Multi-Bounce and 4th in the 8 and under Single Bounce. Korey Walsh took 3rd in the 8 and under Multi-Bounce (Red Division) and Kim Walsh took 4th in the 12 and under Girls Doubles. This is a very large tournament and our kids did great!

Utah has several nationally ranked players. Despite our small population, Utahns are well represented. Doing consistently well in state, regional, and national tournaments has earned these players a top ten national ranking. Luzelle Wilde is ranked seventh in Men's 75+ and second in 80+. Susan Williams is ranked sixth in the Women's A Division. Because of great collegiate play, Utah dominates the Women's 24 and under division. Jennifer Birchenough, Kim Blake, Janette Olsen, and Nicole Passage are all tied for a third place in this division. Val Shewfelt is ranked sixth in Women's 40+ and Norma Carlisle is ranked tenth in the Women's 60+ division. Our juniors really shine with John Sanderson ranked sixth in Boy's 6 and under Multi-Bounce and ninth in 8 and under Multi-Bounce. Kim Walsh is ranked ninth in the Girl's 10 and under Division. But Kristen takes the cake with top ten rankings in three different divisions! She is ranked third in Girl's 14-, fourth in Girl's 16-, and eighth in Girl's 18 and under. That is super!

We are wrapping up the summer Junior's League in August with the State Junior's Championships. Thanks to Ruth McGovern, lots of kids have been playing all summer.

The adult traveling league and the high school league will be starting soon. These are great fun and I encourage all of you to get involved. Contact Ruth McGovern for the traveling league and Marianne Walsh for the high school league. I know Marianne can use a lot of help with sponsorships and coaches.

Even though Utah has one of the smallest populations in the nation, we are ranked 22nd in membership and have more tournaments than most states. Some people think Utah is one of the healthiest states in the nation because of our lifestyle, but I know it's because we play racquetball.
