

The interesting thing about this tournament is that there are no age groups: everyone is seeded according to points earned during regular tournament play at home, and based on the tournament directors' knowledge of the individual players. The three who represented the state of Utah were Terrance Holbrook, Adam Tueller, and Rick Corbridge. The chaperons were Lynn Corbridge and Blaine Holbrook.

Utah's best finish came from Terrance and Adam's doubles team. They took 3rd place in the Gold Division in the Mixed High School category. (Mixed is a doubles team of two players from different high schools. There was also a doubles division for players from the same high school.)

Terrance also made it to the round of 16 in the singles, which put him in very good company with some of the top players in the nation. The individual who beat Terrance in the tiebreaker went on to the semi-finals before losing.

Terrance's tough play and good sportsmanship will go a long way to possibly earning a place on the Junior Olympic team.

BYU Wins 1996 Rocky Mountain Regional Racquetball Tournament, by R. Flick

Defending last year's regional championship, the combined men's and women's racquetball team once again won the regional tournament. The BYU team hosted and participated in the annual regional meet held at BYU on March 7-9. BYU hosted 80 participants representing eleven college/university teams from Idaho, Wyoming, Utah, Colorado, and Arizona. The BYU combined team scores in men's and women's singles/ doubles divisions put BYU in the number one spot. However, it was the women's team who provided the winning total division scores to put BYU in first place.

BYU Wins 1996 World Collegiate Racquetball Tournament, by Roger Flick

The BYU racquetball team defended its title by winning the 1996 World Collegiate Racquetball Tournament, held April 10-13 at the Los Caballeros Athletic Club in Fountain Valley, California.

The Rocky Mountain region was well represented at the World Collegiate Tournament with BYU and University of Southern Colorado. BYU won the men's and women's combined team scoring. The BYU women's team took first place, a great achievement for the women's team. The BYU men's team placed sixth overall. The University of Southern Colorado men's team took first place. All BYU players received medals.

The women's team contributed eighty percent of the points for the overall combined team scores. Christine McAlpine placed an impressive fourth place to the top three players in collegiate racquetball. She played out further than any other BYU women's player to date. BYU's Julie Taylor, playing in Division 2, beat Britt Engle, one of the top seeded female players in the country. Also from the Rocky Mountain region, Tammy Brockbank from Treasure Valley Community College, won the women's first place. This is Tammy's second straight win for her division.




The men's division scoring contributed twenty percent to the overall combined team scores. Tough competition was encountered by the BYU men's players who, because of the seeding, were eliminated earlier in the playout format. One of the finest men's doubles matches was played by BYU's Steve Black and Cameron Boice against Nichols College's Shane Wood and his partner. Shane Wood won the singles championship last year. Steve and Cameron won the second game and came close to winning in the tiebreaker, 8 to 11. It would probably have been the biggest upset in the tournament had they beaten the top-seeded men's doubles players. The men's number one position was won by Eric Mueller from Harvard, the three-year AARA collegiate scholarship winner.


