Improving Your Game... DO YOUR HOMEWORK!

An essential part of tournament preparation is being familiar with your opponent. When you're climbing up the ladder from D's to C's, or beyond, it is important to know as much as you can about the strengths and weaknesses of the players you compete against. You never know who may cross your path on the way to the finals. To maximize your success, study your opponent's style and ability. In other words, DO YOUR HOMEWORK!

Look for the obvious! Have you ever found yourself entering the court, doing your ritual pre-game ball-blasting, ripping those forehands and backhands against the front wall at speeds you swear were faster than a speeding bullet—and just as deadly. You hit practice ceiling lobs that seem to float and slide off the back wall like warm butter on a hot day. You drill untouchable pinches into the corners and watch them snap and roll with precision. You even rehearse the infamous splat shot that skims lightly off the side wall and splatters so perfectly against the front wall. Now you know that your once round ball will stay shaped like squashed play-dough until you revive it by squeezing it between the hardwood floor and your new Nike's.

You're ready! You're pumped! You're adrenaline is rushing! Sweat is starting to bead on your forehead and your racquet strings are screaming "Let's Get Ready to RRRUMBLE!" You calmly shake your opponent's hand and take your place in your second home, the service box. Your drive serve has been known to be as deadly as an atomic bomb, so why not air it out now and ace the first point. You focus on the front wall, choose your spot, bounce the blue Penn exactly nine times—no more, no less. You turn your head slightly to check your poor, unsuspecting receiver, and mumble to yourself "So long sucker." As you start your swing, the racquet

The Utah State Juniors Championships were held at the Redwood Recreation Center on August 21 through 23. Over fifty boys and girls participated in the three-day event. Ruth McGovern did a great job running the show. On Saturday, after the finals, a pool and barbeque party was held for all the players, parents, and coaches. Burgers and chicken were cooked indoors because of possible rain. But the weather cleared enough to jump in the pool after eating.

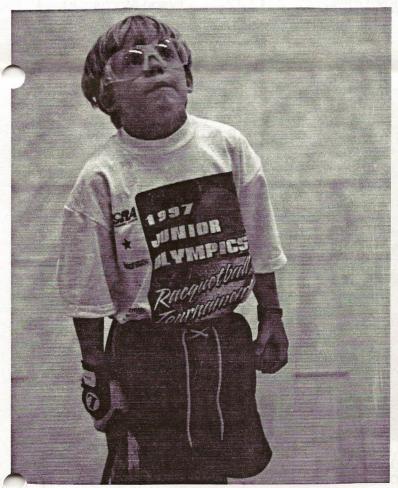
Awards were presented to the tournament winners as well as for the Team Junior summer leagues. Notable finishers were: Adam Tueller, first place in the Boy's 16 and 18 year-old divisions. Cameron Burnside took second in the 16's and first in 14 and under. Kristen Walsh played the Boy's divisions and took second in 18's and third in 16 and under. Jason Cardon won the 12's and took third in the 14 and under. Jonathon Dubach won the 10 and under 1- and 2-bounce divisions. Six-year-old John Sanderson took second in the 10 and under 2 bounce division and first in the 8 and under multi-bounce! A complete list of the tournament results follows this article.

For many of the kids, the tournament was the final event of the summer junior's league. Each week during the summer, juniors from seven clubs around the valley met to compete in a team format. On June 24 an All Star Skills Night at the Redwood Center featured Jim Wilking. The kids were able to get great pointers and compete against one of Utah's great players. A referee clinic was held on August 24 by John Yorkey. Questions about rules were covered as well as certification testing. It's amazing how quickly the youngest players learned the finer points of refereeing a match. All of the kids improved their racquetball skills a lot during this summer league. Believe me, many of them will be competing against the adults soon.

Ruth McGovern coordinates the league and, as usual, did a great job. The staff at Redwood Center and Salt Lake Parks and Recreation are appreciated for supporting this great program for our juniors. This league would also not be possible without a lot of work by our coaches and parents.

Chris Segura's UCLR team won first place in the league. Towne & Country, coached by Enrico Dubach, took second. Other participating clubs were Bountiful Rec Center, coached by Sandi Gunn; Sports Mall and Life Center were both coached by Tony Glavas; Cottonwood Heights, coached by Rose Hernandez; and the Redwood Center, coached by Karen Knudsen and Kris Terry.

makes a quick "swoosh," you drive with your body and power into the swing then crush the ball so hard that you fear that you may have ruptured your opponent's eardrum from the deafening explosion of the ball hitting the front wall. The ball blazes down the lane past the short line, a little long, but it still should be a tough get. As the ball hits the back wall and hops up the alley, you position yourself to put away the return. As you turn and move to your left, the receiver takes one step, following the ball off the short hop, swings, and smashes a forehand roll-out, straight into the front, left corner. "Uh-oh, this dude is a lefty." "Time out, Ref!" Like I said, DO YOUR HOMEWORK!

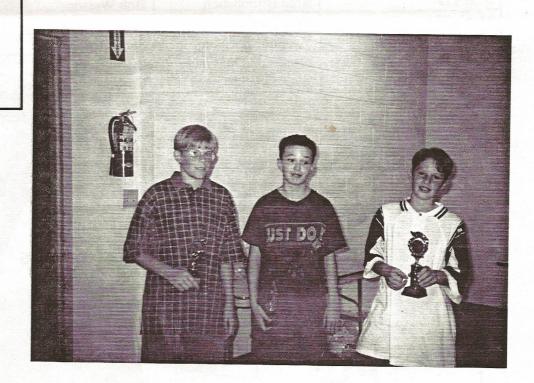
