



Eric has done it again! In December he participated in the Junior World Championships in Miami and won. He was seeded third but felt confident he could win. He had to play the top seed Mike Hurst in the finals whom he had already beaten four times. Congratulations Eric for a fine win!

A.A.R.A. RULE CHANGES

The A.A.R.A. Board of Directors approved the following rule changes to be effective Sept. 1, 1990:

1. The foot fault rule on the serve has been changed to allow the front foot to move on to the FRONT LINE as long as it does not go all the way over. When the server begins his serve, he cannot cross over the back line, but he can be on the line. A foot fault will now be called if the

server begins his serve over the BACK LINE, or his foot extends completely over the FRONT LINE (Rule 4.2, page 10)

- 2. Court hinders are now appealable. A court hinder is defined in Rule 4.15(a)(1) and has not been appealable in the past. (See new Rule 3.7, pg.9.)
- 3. Racquet length may extend to 21 1/2" from the present 21". The racquet size waiver is for test purposes and expires June 1, 1991, unless approved as a permanent rule change. This test racquet cannot be used in the Regional or National Championships.
- 4. A new age bracket of 80+ has been approved for both men's and women's divisions.
- 5. Mixed doubles has been approved for all age divisions except 19+.
- 6. The term "point hinder" has been changed back to "avoidable hinder".
- 7. Beginning in 1990, a two year term will be established for all rule changes instead of a one year term. -AARA Memo



A.A.R.A. DUES INCREASE

The American Amateur Racquetball Association has announced the first membership dues increase in over eight years. Starting January 1, 1991, a one-year membership in the AARA/URA will cost \$15. The AARA has cited increased administrative costs and new production costs associated with "Racquetball Magazine" as the reason for the increase. Beginning in September 1990, all AARA members will receive "Racquetball Magazine" six times per year. Depending on available URA funding you will also receive several issues of the URA Newsletter each year.

The AARA is recognized as one of the strongest athletic governing bodies within the United

States Olympic Committee. We believe this dues increase is necessary to maintain and continue the growth of amateur racquetball in the U.S. We appreciate your support. -WRA News

WHAT'S THE CALL?

Q. In doubles play can a player intentionally swing at the ball to distract his opponents (which could cause the opponent(s) to move out of position long enough to allow his team partner a better shot)?

A. Yes, there is no set rule stated in the rule book that distracting your opponent with a fake swing is a technical foul. The defense must give up position.

SERVING TO WIN!

Serving is the most important part of racquetball. When was the last time that you practiced your serve! Very few players practice at all, let alone work on their serving techniques. The main scoring option for "putting points on the board" is serving, and yet, it is, most likely, the weakest part of your game. Practice is important, and correct practice techniques are a must!

Look at yourself and ask yourself if you are confident enough to hit any selected serve, such as a drive serve, a Z-serve, or a lob serve, at any time during a match. Also, ask yourself if you have one serve that you can depend on. If you are a baseball pitcher you need a fast ball, a curve ball or a slider. If you are a quarterback, you need a short pass, a long bomb, or a pass across the middle. Why should racquetball by any different!

In racquetball, the serve is not just for putting the ball in play, <u>but to score!</u> It is to set a defensive return by your opponent, or to keep your opponent off guard. Therefore, variety is a must! Look at the serve in a mechanical way. Everyone has a different style, and yet basics remain the same. Work on your serve angles, your speed, and your serve height for an added

variety.

After you have practiced some new variations on your serving techniques, consider what happens next. Getting out of the service box after the ball is hit is a major part of the service sequence. You do not have to hit ace serves to win points if you can cover the high percentage return. If you keep pressure on your opponent from the start, you will keep him off guard throughout the rally, he will miss-hit the ball, and will leave it up!

Again, spend some time perfecting your serve variety, your serving techniques and cover positions. You won't be sorry. Check with your club pro for additional help with the serve. It is a very important part of racquetball! -Rick Strout
